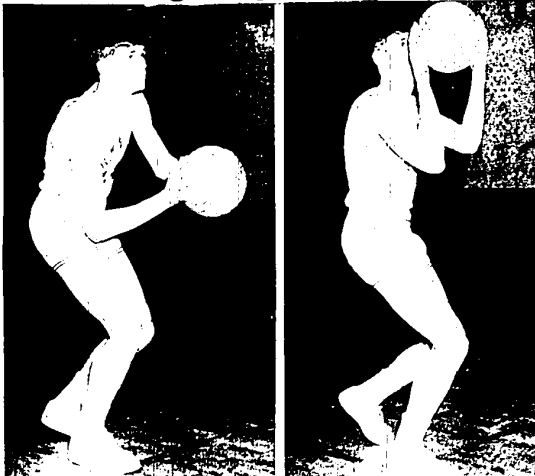


Shooting Style Of A Star



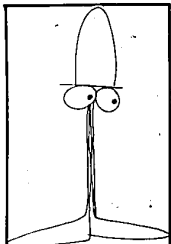

Naturalist At Kenbrook

Lee Curtis, naturalist for the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority, will be the guest speaker at Kenbrook School in Farmington on Wednesday, Feb. 8.

Students will hear a lecture entitled "Let's Watch Wild Animals."

The Authority is a regional park agency, serving the counties of Livingston, Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw and Wayne.

Among its attractions are the Nature Centers at Kensington Metropolitan Park near Milford, Stony Creek Metropolitan Park north of Utica (both open year-around) and Lower Huron Metropolitan Park near Belleville, which is open May through October.

Nature trails are open year-around at these sites as well as at Metropolitan Beach near Mt. Clemens and Hudson Mills Metropolitan Park northwest of Ann Arbor near the Village of Dexter.

Clarenceville Wins Jousts

Things seem to be looking up for the Trojan varsity basketball team. After having won only three of seven games, the team upset state-ranked Northville, who came into the game with a 6-1 record.

The Trojans trailed by one at the end of the first quarter but outscored their opponents in the second period, leaving the floor at halftime with a 22-23 edge. Clarenceville increased their margin to eight points in the third quarter, despite the evidence of foul trouble. Northville tied it all up in the last minutes of play but a foul on Trojan center Ron Ray put him in a one-on-one situation. Ray converted both shots and the game ended with the score: Clarenceville 61, Northville 59.

Ray led all scorers with 16 points and the same number of rebounds. Teammate Chuck Watkins chipped in 13 while Jim Amick, David Wilson, and Mark Diendorf added eight apiece. John Thompson netted six and John McClary had two.

The undefeated gymnastics team had no trouble in disposing of Allen Park and Hillsdale in a tri-meet last week. Jim McCammon grabbed scoring honors in the Hillsdale meet, as the opponents fell to the Trojans, 91-37. McCammon placed first in the long horse, free exercise, and tumbling; plus second on the horizontal bar and parallel bars and third in tumbling and still rings. Charley Morse was first on

the side horse, parallel bars, still rings, and the horizontal bar and second in free exercise. Barry Freshette scored second on the side horse, third in free exercise and parallel bars, and fourth on the long horse.

Tom Stanton gained his points with thirds on the horizontal bar and long horse, while Tom Weber ended up second on the trampoline and Mike McCammon second on the rings. Scoring for Clarenceville ended with a fourth on the trampoline and a fifth in tumbling and Ted Paulson's fourth on the side horse.

Charley Morse's 28 points led Clarenceville in a 70-51 victory over Allen Park. Jim McCammon was a half point behind Morse while Barry Freshette added eight and Mike McCammon four.

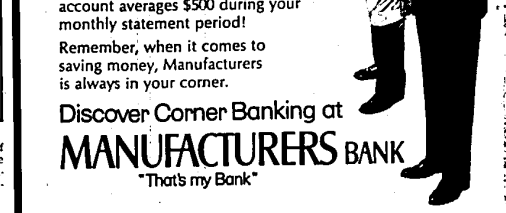
