A series of five classes for diabetics and/or members of their families will be conducted at Botsford General Hospital, 28050 Grand River, beginning Tuesday at 7:30 p.m.

A class will be held each Tuesday for four succeeding weeks. There is no charge for the classes, sponsored by the Oakland County Medical Society, the Oakland County Osteopathic Association and the County Health Department.

One session will be an introduction to diabetes, two classes will be on nutrition, one will deal with insulin techniques, and oral agents, and the final class will concern various tests for diabetes.

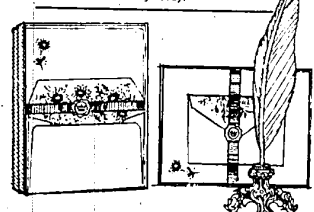
