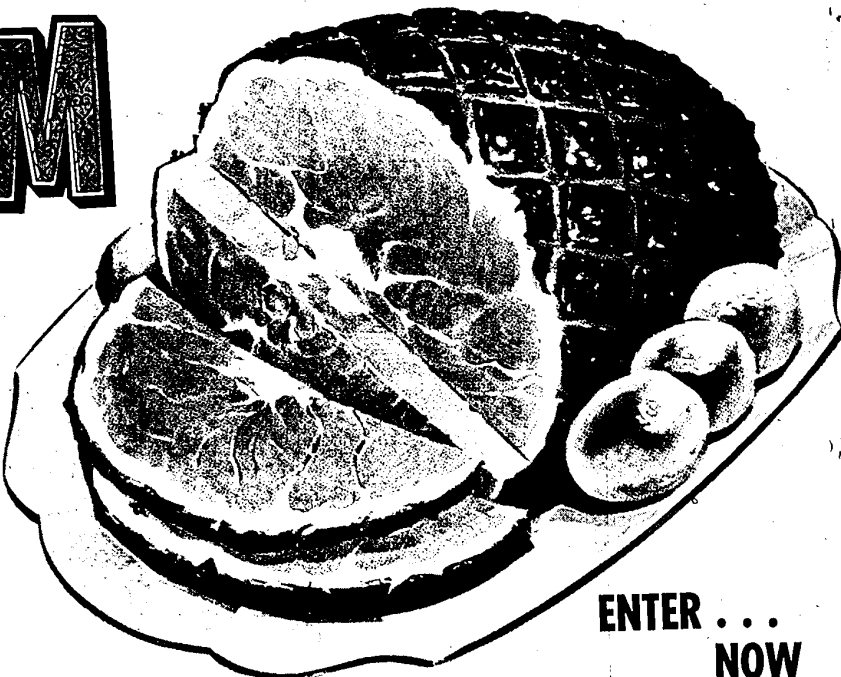
Cards were played and a buffet lunch was served at midnight. This is indeed a very happy birthday for him.
