Two Jewish Congregations Form 1-Year Trial Merger

The board of directors of the Livonia Jewish Congregation (Conservative movement) and Temple Beth Am (Reformed) announces a trial merger. The general membership voted to undertake this trial merger to be in effect for a maximum of 12 months.

During this time the two congregations will have the opportunity for many committees to work out mutual arrangements for operations at all levels. This also pertains to any ritual differences to be agreed on to the satisfaction of all parties concerned.

In 1958, several families newly residing in Livonia formed the Livonia Jewish Congregation under lay leadership. They met in homes and rented local halls for religious services and later opened the doors of an old farm-house on Seven Mile Road to the congregation. The combined efforts of lay members and Cantor Henry J. Blank conducting services.
