## Baseball's Candy Sale Has Started

In a boy's mind, "spring" and "baseball" are synonomous, and it's that it in e of year for the young players of the North Farmington West Bloomfield Baseball for Boys organization.

But it takes some work and money to field a league of 83 teams, to provide suitable baseball diamonds and new uniforms and equipment for 1200 players.

So the organization will conduct a candy sale April 29 through May 8 to raise the necessary \$6,000 for expenses.

Twelve hundred boys, ages 8 through 15, will call at homes in Farmington and West Bloomfield, selling special 31 boxes of candy, in their only fund-raising activity of the year.

The league is divided into five groupings, according to age. There are 20 teams in the "Tee Ball" group for ages 8 and 9; 22 "Mintors" teams for the 11s and 12s; seven "Pony" teams for the 11s and 12s; seven "Pony" team for the boys 13 and 14, and eight "Coil" teams for the oldest players, 15 and 16.

Robert Eady, 22310 Sprucewood, candy sale chairman, announced that the boys also will be working for such prizes as transistor radios, a camera, lfashlight, baseball g loves, bats and baseballs, to be awarded to the top candy salesmen.

Eady also stated that can-dy, which will be delivered, may be ordered during the sale by calling him at GR 4-0850.

And when the candy sale is over, the boys will be out practicing for their summer's schedule of 476 games, the total of all games to be played in the league.
