

Detroit Symphony Lists Premiere of Overture

The world premiere of De-Mozart's Overture to "Don Giovanni" will be given by the Detroit Symphony Orchestra member Harold Laundslager, who will be giving its first performance of the Nielsen work, which was written in 1918.

Laundslager, a resident of Birmingham, has been a violinist with the Symphony since 1951. "The Strait," written in May, 1963, is derived from the composer's impressions of Detroit.

The concert will begin with the same program pianist Malcolm Frager will perform the Schumann Concerto for Piano and Orchestra in A minor, Opus 54.

How about the content of the programs?

It's true all the new shows have a bright, realistic, colorful shine to them, but have the writers been given more freedom, are the situation comedies truly funny, and have the westerns been taken off their diet of stereotyped, phubant.

Variety, the showman's guide, reports that the new season is already quite dismal when it comes to judging the effectiveness of a new show. Lack of virile writing still is listed as a major cause of a program's inability to attract viewers.

Some of the new shows that have caught on so far with the home crowd are "The Iron Horse," "Occasional Wife," "The Time Tunnel," "The Monkeys," "Stage 67," and "T.H.E. Cat."

According to the rating services the American Broadcasting Company is leading the TV race with at least seven new shows that have caused some channel switching. NBC is a close second with four new programs. CBS limps in last with only two.

Of course, CBS, hesitates to worry about since in the weekly top ten TV shows they hold at least five or six positions. Only "Bonanza" and "Batman" give CBS any real competition.
