Township Officials Accused of Stalling

Farmington Democrats are wondering if the Township Board is stalling on filling the vacant Trustee position until after the election in order to return the post to Tom Duke or to some Republican candidate defeated by the voters.

"What other reason could there be for the long delay?" asked Farmington Democratic Chairman Aldo Vagnozzi. "Several times since the post was left vacant by Duke's resignation last June we've been promised that the appointment would be made only to have the promises ignored."

"Since the appointee won't have to run for re-election for more than two years I think the choice should be made before the election so that voters can better determine who should be elected to go with the holdover trustees."

Vagnozzi said the Democrats are mildly-pleased that the Township Board has apparently adopted one of their suggestions calling for a committee to screen the candidates for the post.
