
Mrs. Dennis Daley of Hamburg, sister of the bride was matron of honor.

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**To Discuss Nursing Care For Retarded**  
Nursing of the mentally retarded is the subject of a conference to be held at the Plymouth State Home and Training School Oct. 19 and 20.

Aimed at achieving better care of the mentally retarded in home, clinic, hospital and institution, is the fourth annual conference on the subject and directed to nurses working with such cases.

The program will include a discussion of the changing pattern of care of retarded children, a discussion of developing nursing skills in this area, and a report on advances in nursing education to include this specialty.

Participating in the program will be Dr. Homer Weir, superintendent of the Plymouth Home, Dr. Cyrus Stinson, associate director of research there, and Dr. Vernon Stehman, assistant director of the Michigan Department of Mental Health.
