**GOING UP CURTAIN**

Little news items like autumn leaves have been fluttering silently but steadily on my already over-crowded desk. Time to get the fleshy rake that looks somewhat like my gnarled hand to sweep the debris into an open wastebasket or carefully digest the theatrical tidbits for subsequent reporting.

An attractive brochure from the Performing Arts Department of Cass Technical High School in Detroit states the director of their department is a Livonian, Pierre J. Renner, 28543 Lyndon, is in charge of a most ambitious program of productions: "Thurber Carnival" (Nov. 17-18).

Renner's associate director is Gerald Bovenchen. He is busy staging the forthcoming Livonia-Redford Players' Guild musical "Oliver." It would appear that both these Livonians are mighty active either rehearsing, planning, or watching a performance of one of their many theatrical assignments.

Speaking of assignments, Jake Rumpf was given the task of shaping up the fall Plymouth Theatre Guild play, "The Marriage-Go-Round." Jake over the years with the Guild has been an actor, set constructor, scenery painter, prop man, curtain puller. Well, you name it and Jake has had the job.

Play of the Month series subscription orders are being accepted in Ann Arbor this week. The six plays being presented by the Professional Theater program in Ann Arbor are worthy of your attention: "The Royal Hunt of the Sun" (Nov. 13-15) "Lux" (Dec. 13-14) "The Lion in Winter" (Jan. 31-Feb. 1) "Porgy and Bess" (Feb. 17-18) "After the Fall" (Mar. 6-7) "The Odd Couple" (Mar. 28-30).

Wayne State University Players opened their 1966-67 season with a nostalgic production of "Take Me Along." Jacqueline Turri sang beautifully and gave the role of Lily real depth. Paul Marchese ably filled the comic shoes of Jackie Gleason, who played Sid Davis in the Broadway production. Greg Larkin and Kirk Olstewski turned in strong performances.

The APA production of "We Comrades Three" still remains somewhat muddled. Even the assistance of Helen Hayes could not rescue long stretches of this Walt Whitman spectacle. Richard Baldrige took Whitman's "Leaves of Grass," a vibrant, powerful piece of writing, and tried to adapt it to the stage.

At times the adaptation worked. Too often the lofty language was far too rotund and sonorous for the miniature confines of the Lydia Mendelssohn stage. Perhaps this show should be left for the vast-green and cinematic tricks of the Cinemas process. I'm quite sure that Charlton Heston would love to play the rugged, stormy Walt.
