

Urge Care Handling Poisons

Useful and harmless when properly used, household cleaners, pesticides, medicines, paints and any number of other staple supplies are potential killers when handled carelessly.

This warning comes from the Greater Detroit Safety Council, a chapter of the National Safety Council.

"Anything can be a poison if it is misused," says Gerald E. Montgomery, executive director of the local safety group. "People should act on the principle that if it isn't food it is poison."

To prevent your family from becoming statistics, the National Safety Council offers the following suggestions:

- Keep all drugs and medicines far out of the reach of children, even if it means a separate, locked cabinet.
- Label all containers, and mark prescriptions with the date of issue, the dosage, and the patient's name.
- Do not keep cleaners or any other toxic chemicals in any place accessible to children.

- Get rid of an old, unlabeled or discolored medicine by pouring it down the drain—never by throwing the bottles in the wastebasket where youngsters might find them.

- Before administering any drug, read the label in a good light.

- Paste the day and night phone numbers of your doctor, druggist and any local poison control center to the wall of the cabinet.

- When known poisons, such as iodine or alcohol, are necessary, treat them so they'll be recognizable even in a dark room. Tape the cap shut; glue on sandpaper, rough side out; or stick a sharp pin through the stopper.

- Never put anything potentially poisonous in a cup, pop bottle or other container that normally holds food. Anyone, adult or child, might assume it is edible.

- Impress the children that they must not taste unknown liquids, pills, leaves, roots.

- Safety-check your medicine chest at least twice a year, making sure all dangerous drugs are out and all needed materials are at hand.
