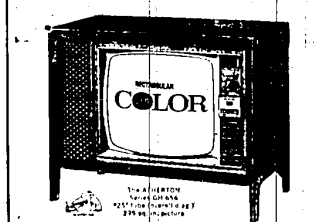

At a recent social function where dessert and coffee was served to a large group, the partners of dessert were most impressed by the delicious and fluffy says more but my caloric counters tells me no type of cake.

The hostess chairman, Mrs. Clayton O'Dell of Nottingham Knoll was delighted with "What kind of cake is this? What are its ingredients and may we have the recipe?"

Many had whispered that had they known grated carrots were in its makings, they probably would have passed up the cake but were glad they didn't. Billie O'Dell consented to sharing the recipe with us. It's called Carrot Cake and consists of three eggs, two cups sugar, one cup vegetable oil, one teaspoon salt, one teaspoon baking soda, one teaspoon cinnamon, two cups flour, two cups finely grated carrot, one cup chopped nuts

and one cup crushed drained pineapple.

MIX THE FIRST three ingredients in a bowl. Add next four ingredients and combine. They add the next three items one at a time. Mix all ingredients well. No other liquid is necessary. Bake in an oblong pyrex pan in a 350 degree oven for approximately 40 minutes and may take as long as 60 minutes, depending on how well the pineapple is drained and the moisture content of the carrots.

Top with a Whip Cream Frosting. When cake is cooled, consisting of one-half stick of butter or margarine, eight cups of cream cheese, two teaspoons vanilla, one pound box of confectioners sugar and one-half cup of chopped nuts. Clean all the ingredients and then add the chopped nuts.

They want to give it a try at the desert after your Thanksgiving dinner.

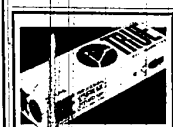

Approximately 80 members were present during the visit of Mrs. Sergey Poborka and her four-year-old son, Sergey, Jr. The purpose of their visit was to accept contributions of more than \$2,200 from the pre-Halloween sale of candy for the Michigan Kidney Foundation.

The sale of the candy helps to provide funds not now available through any other source to support the 14 drug banks of the foundation as well as research leading to medical breakthroughs in kidney transplantations and the use of the artificial kidney.

Mrs. Poborka told the group that her son suffers from a kidney disease that will be with him for life and that he has been on drugs from one of the Kidney Foundation drug banks for several years.

(Continued from Page 1) not use its funds for anything beyond the school property.

The parents appeared before the West Bloomfield Township Board last week and presented their case. That Board agreed to share the cost of installing the 1,750 foot sidewalk.

The Observer learned that the parents had discussed the problem with Farmington Township Supervisor Curt Hall and that the matter is expected to come up at the next Township Board meeting Nov. 28.

Approval of this time is expected as the Township has participated in similar projects in the past. Under the terms of the agreement worked out with West Bloomfield the two townships will each pay 25 percent of the cost not to exceed \$10,000 each while the residents will finance the rest.

West Bloomfield Township Supervisor Duane K. Sanford said that it is hoped that the sidewalk can be installed this fall.

(Continued from Page 1) first pay \$204 per household, while the Clarenceville School District residents pay \$5.77.

The breakdown in the Township is: 11.67, Oakland County Township operating \$2.53 plus \$2.28 for police and fire protection in the Township along with the levy for the District Library and the Tarabus Sewer Arm. School tax rate for the Farmington School District is \$3.50, while 2.11 goes to the Oakland Community College.

is the Clarenceville School District the school rate is \$9.60 and the Oakland Community College levy is 3.74. The rate for the Oakland Intermediate School District is \$2.95 in both school districts.

Estimated total roll in the Township is \$4,850,671.62. Of this \$488,209.60 is for personal property, while \$4,462,462.02 is for real property.

The total assessed valuation in the Township is \$51,449,190. Property is currently being assessed at 20 to 25 percent in the Township. The state equalization factor for the area is 2.10 which brings the equalized valuation to \$108,026,499.

In the City property is assessed at 48 percent of value and the total assessed valuation is \$26,942,460. The City's equalization factor is 1.13 which brings the equalized valuation to \$30,444,880.

Under the new state constitution bill local governmental units will have to begin assessing property at 50
