DRIVES ON REVOKED LICENSE

Scofflaw Faces Court Again

A Brighton man, with a string of convictions for driving while permission to do so has been denied by the State, is due for an appearance Dec. 7 in Livonia Municipal Court on charges stemming from a minor accident.

He is Richard H. Kinnell, 33, of 4276 Highercrest, Brighton, arrested in Livonia Oct. 25 after his car "varied course without safe observation" and struck another vehicle.

Police say Kinnell left the scene of the accident without identifying himself and was arrested a short distance away.

Kinnell's driving record dates back to 1952 when his

license was suspended for 45 days.

His license was revoked from June 10, 1957 to June 10, 1962.

It was again revoked June 15 of this year until April 10, 1968.

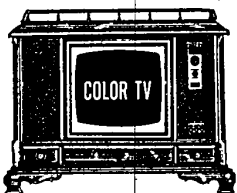

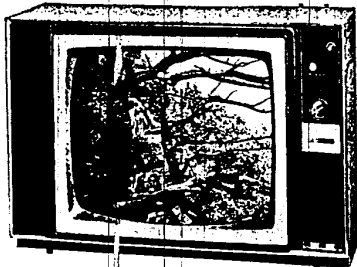
