Vernor's Birthday Observed

Commemorating the 100th anniversary of the Vernor Company, a Business Foundation member of the Detroit Historical Society, the Detroit Historical Museum is featuring an exhibit dealing with the company history through Dec. 31.

The anniversary exhibit will feature a turn-of-the-century soda fountain restored by the Detroit Historical Museum, along with vintage dispensers and early style bottles. The Vernor Company will install an animated Vernor's gnome, which is over 60 years old. The elf, used for many years in Vernor's advertising, is now obsolete and a unique historic item. Vernors began in Detroit in 1866, it is founded by

James Vernor in his pharmacy at 235 Woodward Ave. In the tradition of those days, each pharmacist would create his own special fountain drink for his customers. James Vernor was no exception—his drink—Vernors—was so enthusiastically received that he found himself in the business of providing the drink to other soda fountains.

Around the turn of the century, James Vernor, sole proprietor and manufacturer of Vernors Ginger Ale, moved to his new quarters at 33 Woodward Ave. Not only did he supply extract for fountain service, but he began bottling Vernors.

His plant, at the foot of Woodward became the source before and after stop

for families making the many excursion boat trips. Visitors to the Vernors Centennial Exhibit at the Detroit Historical Museum may also view models of delivery vehicles, photographs of early shops and original art work for advertisements of 1930. One unit shows how a bottle cap is made from start to use.

The Detroit Historical Museum is open Tuesday through Sunday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Closed Monday. Admission is free.

He and his wife, Sandra, have a two-year-old son, Mark.

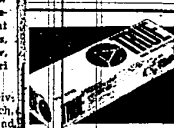

Reading Expert Slates Lecture

A report in the first five years of I.T.A. the self-starter Initial Teaching Alphabet, in British schools will be made to Oakland County educators Monday, Dec. 12.

John A. Downing, reading research officer, University of London Institute of Education, who has worked with the Initial Teaching Alphabet since its introduction, will be the speaker.

In the past three years some 4,800 children in Oakland County have been introduced to reading through this medium. There are 72 first grade classes, and nine special education classes using I.T.A. this year.

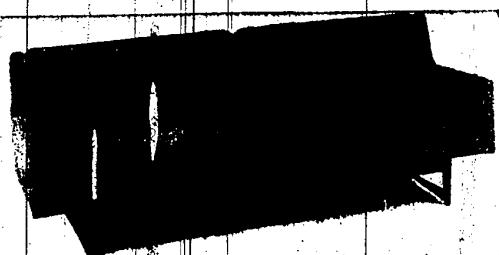
