### Schools Name 2 Directors

Two new administrators for the Farmington School District began work this week. Both positions were newly created.

They are Joseph Nicita, as Director of Secondary Education, and LeRoy Robert Barfman, Director of Personnel.

Nicita, who will supervise the educational work and programs of children in secondary schools, came to the Farmington School District from Franklin Mills where he served as a junior high school principal since 1964.

He began his teaching career with the Wyandotte School District in 1955. In 1959, he started teaching in the Taylor Schools and in 1963 transferred to the Huron School District as principal at both the junior and senior high schools.

Nicita, 33, received his BS degree from Eastern Michigan University in 1955 and since has earned an MA degree. Next year he expects to complete requirements for Educational Specialist.

The new Director of Secondary Education is married and the father of four children.

Barfman started teaching with the Detroit Public in 1955 and continued with them until transferring to Dearborn Public Schools as a teacher-scoutmaster from 1957-59. He served the Nankin Schools for two years in an administrative capacity and finally came to Farmington from Inkster Public Schools.

Besides being an educator, Barfman is active in the United States Air Force Reserve where he is a Major in Chief Administrative Services of the Air National Guard. His active military service was with the Air Force in the Far East as a First Lieutenant Electronic Officer from 1954-55.

Barfman's educational achievements include a BS in Education from Wayne State University in 1954, a master's in Education, also from Wayne in 1957, and work in educational administration from both Wayne and University of Michigan.

Barfman is married and has one child.

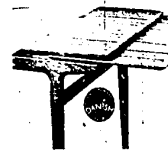
It was suggested that the school release grades one at a time, that a safety patrol program be developed and that volunteer mothers on the assignment of the school principal again be used as guard at the hill.
