**'God the Creator' Science Text Dec. 3**

"God the Only Cause and Creator" is the title of this week's Lesson-Scripture to be read in all Christian Science churches this Sunday. Scriptural readings include Matthew's account of Jesus healing of the blind man who fell "offtimes... into the fire, and oft into water," and Jesus' admonition to his disciples, "If ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, Remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you." A correlative passage from the denationalist textbook "Science and Health with a Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy, is "Our Master cast out devils (evils) and healed the sick. It should be said of his followers also, that they can fear and all evil out of themselves and other and heal the sick. God will heal the sick through man whenever man is governed by God. "Truth casts out error not as it did nineteen centuries ago."
