## Photographer Exhibits Shots Of Village

The first public exhibition of a collection of black and white pictures taken at Greenfield Village by world famous photographer, Philippe Halsman, is on display in the lobby of the First Federal Savings and Loan Association Building in downtown Detroit.

Visiting the Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village last year, Halsman recorded on film the many activities and exhibits at the 260-acre historical complex. A group of these same photographs in color was used for a special eight page feature in the July issue of Readers Digest.

Halsman's photographs have appeared on the cover of Life Magazine a record of 98 times. He has made two around the world tours for Time-Life on picture taking assignments. In 1963 he was one of three Americans selected in the "World's International Photographers" exhibit at the Huntington Hartford Museum of Modern Art.

Halsman is the author of several photographic books. Two of his portraits, Adlai Stevenson and Dr. Albert Einstein, appeared on U.S. postage stamps.

The special exhibition of Greenfield Village photographs will be open through the holiday season until mid-January, during the regular business hours, at First Federal Savings and Loan, 930 a.m. until 4 p.m., Monday through Thursday and until 6 p.m., Friday.

# Police Chief Warns of Holiday Traffic Tragedies

Rodger Vanderveen, acting Chief of Police, observed that the Christmas Holidays are traditionally the most disastrous in terms of our traffic record — and that the upcoming New Year's weekend is usually close behind.

"This is a tragic commentary," the chief emphasized, "especially at the time of year when 'good will toward men' should be the dominant spirit."

What happens to dislocate our traffic record so drastically during this season?

The chief contends a basic cause is a sort of "psychological dislocation" that takes place in people.

"We know better, but still we get caught up in a complex turmoil — last minute rushes, parties, heavier than normal drinking... all kinds of pressures."

"A person subjected to such stress," he continued, "is less able to cope with the normal, every-day problems of staying safe — and this applies to walkers as well as drivers."

The chief admitted it's difficult to change people, but did point out that every walker or driver has the responsibility to recognize the psychological danger signals in himself and modify his behavior accordingly.

"I don't believe that's asking too much," acting Chief Vanderveen emphasized. "We all know the right and safe way of doing things. We may just have to work a little harder doing it."

The chief cited parties and drinking as an example. We can't overdo and they slide behind the wheel of a car with it, just this time."

There are better, surer ways of getting home, he continued. Acting Chief Vanderveen urged all Plymouth citizens to think ahead about the special dangers of the season, of the weather, and of the holiday's psychological pressures — and to adjust accordingly.

At the same time, he pledged all steps possible to hold down this year's holiday record to within reasonable limits; and ended with this word of warning:

"Your police department will be out with all the manpower we can muster to protect those who simply can't seem to cope of their own accord with the stresses of the season. That's a bit of 'psychology' for which we have the prime responsibility."

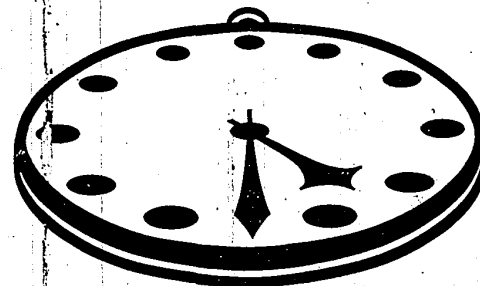

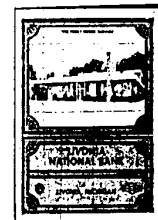
