Two evening adult classes directed to full-time employees will be offered by the Oakland Community College Business Department beginning Jan. 5.

Principles of Supervision will be offered Mondays from 7 to 10 p.m. at the Auburn Hills Campus. For employees in supervisory capacities who wish to upgrade their skills and for persons aspiring to supervisory positions, this class will be taught by Assistant Professor Gary Falkenberg and offers three hours credit. Classes begin on Jan. 5.

Survey of Taxation, also for three credit hours, is scheduled for Thursdays from 7 to 10 p.m. at the Auburn Hills Campus and will begin on Jan. 5. This class, taught by Assistant Professor N. J. Brantley, CPA, is for tax accountants, bookkeepers, and for individuals who wish to sharpen up their general accounting skills and/or prepare their own tax forms.

Tuition is \$10 enrollment fee plus \$10 per credit hour.


