The City Council Monday The City Council Mounay night approved a two-year contract that had been rati-fied eather by members of Local 1456 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employes, AFL-CIO.

There is no immediate wage increase, but a 19 cent hike will go into effect July 1, when the new fiscal year begins. The contract provides that the next year.

Covered by the part are 10 employes of two departments — public works and water-and-sewer. Supervisory and clerical personnel are excluded.

A highlight of the contract is time-and-a-half for overtime beyond 40 hours a week. Farmington was reported to be one of the few municipalities in the metropolitan area without such a provision. The fovertime pay provision fakes effect March 1.
