Area Catholic Parishes Open 8-Week Human Relations Study

Auxiliary Bishop Henry E. Donnelly opened Project Commitment, the Roman Catholic Education Program on Race Relations, for 33 parishes of Wayne County west of Telegraph Road, Tuesday night, at Madonna College in Livonia. Five hundred area Catholic lay leaders and Negroes from inner city parishes are participating.

The leadership training program also began in three other areas of the Detroit Metropolitan Community: 19 parishes of South Oakland County south of 14 Mile; 27 parishes of Macomb County south of 14 Mile; and 22 parishes of Oakland County north of 14 Mile.

The spring phase of Project Commitment will bring the total number of parishes involved in Project Commitment to over 330 Detroit area parishes with more than 5,000 leaders taking part so far. Many of these parishes, in turn, have established their own Project Commitment programs on the parish and neighborhood levels.

Project Commitment is an Archdiocesan Program on Human Relations designed to communicate the teachings of the Catholic church and the need in society for racial justice to a leadership group in every parish in the archdiocese in the most practical way and in a minimum of time.

In launching Project Commitment last Spring Archbishop John F. Darden told lay leaders: "We must be in the forefront of those who endeavor to provide action to root out of the world and the society in which we live, the very basic evils that beset us."

"We, who are committed to a manner of action that joins man with man, must be most of all intolerant of injustice, of discrimination, of oppression, of all evils that man is subject to in the world in which we live today."
