Exhibited for the first time in its entirety, some 300 drawings and etching in the Lydia Winston Malbin collection will go on view at the Detroit Institute of Arts April 28.

"Many theories of today's avant garde and of experimentalists in all media were articulated by Boccioni, a central figure of the Italian Futurist movement, who died in 1916.

This extraordinary collection is on permanent loan to the museum from Mrs. Lydia Winston Malbin. She and her late husband, Harry Lewis Winston, acquired the drawings from Boccioni's sister.

"The Lydia Winston Malbin Collection of Boccioni Drawings" will be shown with related sculpture and paintings by the artist through May 28.
