### LIBRARY PROPOSITION

PROPOSITION TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF ADEQUATE LIBRARY FACILITIES ON TWELVE MILE ROAD IN THE TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON AND FOR OTHER LIBRARY PURPOSES.
