

Food Service People Eye Emergencies

Fifty southern Oakland County school food service people attended a Southeastern Michigan Red Cross disaster workshop at North Farmington High School, 32900 13 Mile Road on May 25. Purpose of the meeting was to determine the role of the school personnel in feeding victims in time of disaster.

Mrs. Ella Plichta, School Lunch Supervisor of the Farmington schools conducted the meeting and spoke to the group on the subject, "Role of Lunchroom Personnel in Disaster Emergency."

Mrs. F. F. Stetkub, Volunteer Chairman, Food Service, Southeastern Michigan Chapter of the Red Cross, told of the need for safe water, sanitation and utilities.

Wallace Crane, Director of Civil Defense for Oakland County told the responsibilities of public agencies in a disaster situation.

E. K. R. v. E. I., assistant manager and Mr. Kenneth Winter, Oakland regional manager for Southeastern Michigan Chapter of the Red Cross spoke briefly to the group.

School districts represented included Farmington, Ferndale, Berkley, Royal Oak, Southfield, Novi and Clarkston. Sitting as observers were Miss Vera Johnson, Oakland County School Lunch Consultant and Mrs. Shirley McCoy who holds a similar post in Wayne County.

YMCA Schedules Backyard Swim Instruction in Area

A community wide program of backyard swimming instruction sponsored by the Farmington Area YMCA gets underway June 19.

Two separate periods—June 19 to July 14 and July 17 to Aug. 11 are planned. One course in junior and senior life saving instruction will be offered to anyone over the age of 12 during the summer.

Registration for the program is June 5 between 4 and 8 p.m. for current YMCA members. Registrations will be open June 6 between 4 and 8 p.m. for those wishing to join the Y and register for the classes.

A YMCA membership is required to participate in the program. Family membership is \$15 per year, while a youth membership is priced at \$5.

The swimming classes are open to both boys and girls who are 48 inches tall and will be over the age of six by July 1. The sessions will meet for 45 minutes twice a week and have a minimum of eight and a maximum of 10 members. Cost of the lessons is \$8.50. The life saving instruction requires that the students be able to swim 400 yards in addition to being over the age of 12. The eight week course includes 16 hours instruction with the session meeting once a week for two hours.

Included in the \$15 course fee is a Red Cross life saving book.

In the general instruction the groups will be arranged by swimming ability and every effort will be made to assign them to the most convenient pool. Mary Keen, a physical education teacher at the Farmington Public Schools, will conduct the classes.
