The girls in the other car said that the Wiggins auto was passing them when they "saw something fly by."

Wiggins, who was not ticketed, was traveling about 45-50 miles per hour at the time of the accident.

Westland Opens Ball Schedule

Westland's Parks and Recreation Department last week unveiled the baseball and softball program for the 1967 season.

In baseball league play, the Recreation Department is sponsoring a 12 team class "F" League for boys 14 years of age and under. This league opened competitive play on June 1. The "F" boys play on Tuesday and Thursday at 6 p.m. at the following sites: Wayne-Ford Civic Center, Stottlemeyer Park, Henry Ruff and Palmer, and Marshall Jr. High.

The Class "C" league has only three teams entered so far with hopes of a fourth team. This league for boys 15 and under will begin play the second week in June.

This year the Recreation Program is running a class "D" League, boys 18 and under. There are eight teams scheduled to play. The league is comprised of four Westland teams, one from Westland, two from Wayne, and one from Belleville.

These teams will play a 14 game schedule starting June 8. The playing sites are at Wayne Memorial High School, Inkster Park, Wayne Ford Civic Center, and Belleville High. The games will be played at 6 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday.

In the softball leagues, the Men's Class "A" Slow Pitch League has eight teams entered and began May 29.

The "A" League plays at 6:30 p.m. every Monday and Wednesday on diamonds 9, 10, 12, 13 in Edward Hines Parkway.

The men's "C" Slow Pitch League also has eight teams entered, but they only play on Fridays. The "C" League

uses the same fields as the "A" league. The "C" League started play on May 26.

The Women's Modified Slow Pitch League has five teams ready to compete for trophies. This league will start playing next week. The girls play all of their games under the lights at Garden City East High. The games are scheduled for 8 p.m. and 9:30 p.m. on Wednesdays.

Also, once the Summer Program on the playgrounds begins, there will be an opportunity for the seven, eight, and nine year olds for the T-Ball Leagues.

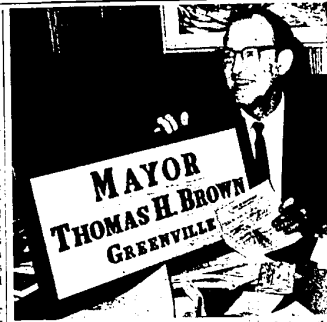
Escapée Is Captured In Westland

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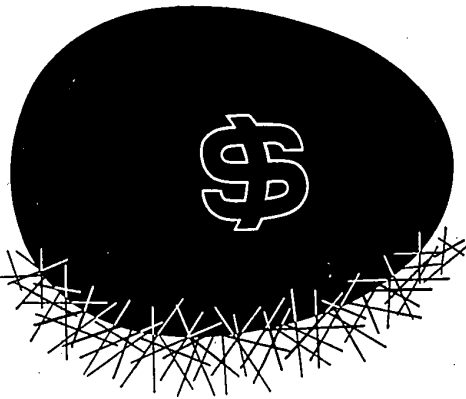
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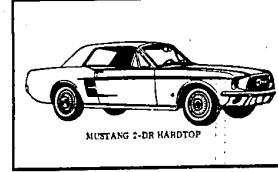
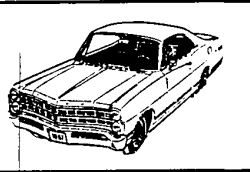
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
