

Greenfield Village Sets Program, New Hours

Summer visitors will have additional time to tour the historic homes and shops at the Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village, effective June 15 through Labor Day, visiting hours will be 9 a.m. until 6:30 p.m.

Several special events are scheduled during the season beginning with the **Muscle Leaders Festival at Greenfield Village, June 24-25.** More than 600 costumed participants will vie for marksmanship honors in this annual shoot out. Camera fans have an excellent chance to film the activities on the field and along the colorful streets and historic homes.

On July 4th the public is invited to witness the "Let Freedom Ring" program at the Mall in front of the Henry Ford Museum, co-sponsored by the Hi-Y Clubs of the YMCA. The Museum building entrance is a reproduction of Independence Hall.

The American Drama Festival opens on Friday, July 7. Four plays will be presented in repertory through Sept. 15. Curtain time is 8:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday, in the Museum theater.

The opening production will be Augustin Daly's historic comedy, "Under the Gaslight." On July 17, "Our American Cousin" opens, followed by "The Henrietta" on July 31, "Shenandoah" is the fourth play in the series and opens August 14. The plays will rotate nightly in repertory style.

The Old Car Festival will be held Sept. 16-17 at Greenfield Village. More than 300 vintage automobiles dating back to 1890 will take part in this annual motoring history pageant.

The Glidden Tour of Antique Autos will begin a five day tour of Michigan starting at Greenfield Village on Tuesday following the Old Car Festival.

The driving route for this national antique car event will include historic homes.

Mercy Sets Drama Workshop
