

# 42 Years - Happy Ones For Mildred Hamlin

When interviewing Mildred Hamlin, it's difficult to know if you are interviewing the lady or her husband, Delos.

After sharing his life for 42 years, Mrs. Hamlin so automatically says "Delos and I" that the joy she has found in her marriage radiates all through her conversation.

HAMLIN'S WIFE naturally doesn't follow him to his job as chairman of the Oakland County Board of Supervisors, but it is very apparent the couple share almost all their interests.

When she married in 1923, Mrs. Hamlin didn't share his interest in hunting, but she has done something about that over the years.

When talking about it, she says, "I didn't know when we

set our wedding date for Oct. 16 that third season opened Oct. 15."

Today she is a crack shot and last year bagged an eight point buck which gave Hamlin 60 much pride he had it mounted.

About her skills, Mrs. Hamlin comments, "I never have practiced shooting. I'm just a natural shot or another Adie Oakley."

Her home here on Cass is on a wooded lot, which makes it hard to raise flowers, a fact she says "frustrates" her.

"I always used to say," she maintains, "that when the children got married, I wanted one in California, one in Michigan and one somewhere else so I'd have to travel to see them."

But the Hamlin children aren't too spread out. Fred lives in Farmington, Ruth (Mrs. David Clark) in Lakeview and Jane (Mrs. Tony Dyers) in Baltimore.

When Jane met her husband while she was teaching in Europe, her parents traveled there to meet him. Jane lived in La Rochelle, France, and an oil painting of the city's harbor is a cherished Hamlin possession.

TRAVEL. OR NOT. Mrs. Hamlin and her husband have been solid Farmington stock since they moved here before the war in 1923.

They came here that year from Central Michigan University.

In conversation she doesn't dwell on these things and herself. She would much rather talk about her husband.

Mostly she is proud of his even-tempered disposition.

"He doesn't like conflict," she notes. He is better in talking things out sensibly.

"And with all the unrest throughout the world, it seems as if people could get together and talk rationally, we'd be a lot better off. We're really all one big family."

GAVLE is a town just sixty miles North of Stockholm. The Fredrickson family intended showing her


## Garden Party Marks 80th Birthday
