## Bicycles Create Safety Haza

Every summer the traffic toll of children killed while riding bicycles mounts.
Last summer four Farmington youths died from injuries suffered in accidents occuring while they were on bikes.
Cointless other accidents occured in the township.

In the City of Farmington three children were injured, while another six escaped with-

were injured, while another six escaped with out injury.
Oftentimes the accident is not the fault of the driver of the automobile.
Sometimes it is.
In Farmington Township the danger is increased by the relatively high speed limits on the roads and the lack of traffic signals to slow down vehicles.
The problem is intensified by cyclists who persist in darting back and forth across roads and those who ride after dark without lights.

SHORT OF imposing unrealistic speed limits on the highways or of confiscating all bikes without lighting and then weeding out the youths who will not observe simple precautions, there is no guarantee that this summer will be day different.

The Automobile Club sums up a parent's responsibility in this area when it admonishes:

"Be sure your child is ready for a bicycle before you permit him to have one. It is your responsibility as a parent to teach him to be a responsible bicycle driver. He should always obey all signals, just like any other driver; keep the right, ride single file, and not weave in and out of traffic lanes. Be SURE he is a good driver before he takes the bicycle out into the street."

This year's fatalities will be the same unless they can be avoided through car e on veryone's part—motorist, cyclist and parents.
