Churches Pre-Date Government

Although Farmington as a village government dates back to 1867, some of its churches are much older. Farmington's Presbyterian church was founded in 1825 as part of a movement spurred by the Rev. John Montelli,

by the Rev. John Montells, known statewide as one of the co-founders of the University of Michigan. The Baptists organized in Michigan for the first time in Pontace in 1819. By 1826 other Baptist churches had been organized in three other Oskitand' County settlements--Farming-ton, Troy and Stony Creek.

Grand River Not First Route West

The Grand River Avenue that now goes through Farmington is not the original route of the Detroit to Grand Rapids road.

Originally in the 1830's, the route followed what is now 192-12 from Detroit to Pontiae. At Pontiae, the road branched rone part going north to Flant, Saginaw and Bay City, the other going westward on what is now M-59 to Howell and thence to Grand Rapids.

The Detroit to Howell route, along which Farmington was built, came at a later date.
