Less Butter Use Forecast

Americans will consume less evaporated milk, condensed milk, cream and butter in the next decade, say Michigan State University scientists.

But they'll drink about the same amount of fluid milk per person and eat more cheese and ice cream.

The scientists point out that less butter will be used on the table, but it may be used increasingly in baked products.

The researchers add that dehydrated dairy products will continue to be popular for the next decade. Nonfat dry milk will be used to fortify skim milk, ice cream and cottage cheese.

U-D Offers Course For Secretaries
