Good Quality Wood Floors Essential To Fine Home

Good quality finish floors are essential for a truly well built home even though it is carpited at the outset. The house without such floors is incomplete.

Their omission is false economy which the original buyer of the house as well as succeeding owners, is likely to regret.

That is the position taken by many builders, and, not surprisingly, endorsed by hardwood flooring producers.

The issue has been brought to the fore by the current practice of some builders of skimping on costs by offering carpeting over concrete slab bases or over plywood subflooring, without finished floors.

"This is a poor practice," says Henry H. Willins, executive vice president of the National Oak Flooring Manufacturers' Association.

"Carpeting lasts only a few years at best," he declares, "if therefore should not be included for long term financing as is sometimes done. Under such an arrangement the home owner could still be paying principal and interest on carpeting that had long since worn out and been replaced."

A Squirt Of Bleach Can Aid Dingy House

A little squirt of liquid bleach, that is.

A cardinal rule for dealing with a dingy house—especially one undergoing a transition from one season to another—is to dig at the dirt, and the sooner the better! Here are some handy tips:

For spot jobs, nothing does a better clean-up than a handy, pink-size plastic squeeze bottle filled with a sturdy solution containing a disinfectant such as liquid chlorine bleach (¼ cup household bleach to a gallon of water).

Several bottles strategically placed in the laundry, kitchen and bath will encourage you to handle the tasks more quickly.

Of course, the squeeze bottles should be correctly labeled—and kept out of reach of small children.

Drainboards are helped immensely with a squirt or two each time you do the dishes.

In the bath or shower, swish away unsightly mold with a small, narrow brush dipped in the solution and lightly brushed over the stained masonry between the tiles.

Wall tiles, too, will sparkle when washed with a cloth dampened with the solution. Get a shower curtain that's ashamed to be seen?

Take it down, place it in the bathtub and let it soak for five minutes in a mixture of this same chlorine bleach solution. Carefully pre-treat the heavily soiled spots, rinse and hang to drip-dry.

There's hardly a home to-day that doesn't have Venetian blinds in some part of the house. Have you looked

at the pull cords and center tapes lately?

Are they supposed to be white, or have they discolored from long use?

Take the entire shade down, after dusting with a clean cloth, and then soak it in the bathtub in the bleach solution.

To make this little household helper, use a pint bottle (it's the most economical size, since the bleach solution strength is effective for about a week), and punch holes in the cap top to facilitate squeezing out the liquid.

Charcoal Keeps Water Fresh

Many of our harder garden flowers, such as zinnias, marigolds, and asters, when cut, will give the water in the vase in which they stand an unpleasant odor.

By dropping in a piece of charcoal in the vase, you can eliminate this odor.
