

Fishing Holes Favorite Spots



Fishing is a pastime that delights the young and old. Farmington has two "training grounds" or small fishing holes for the young fishermen located within its borders.

The first, located north of Grand River between Halstead and Haggerty yields bluegills, bass and some pike.

The second, between 13 and 14 Mile Rd., off Farmington Rd., is stocked with bass and catfish.

Youngsters from all over come to try their hand at the sport. Farmington's young fishermen ride their bikes to an hour or so of fishing, while residents from other areas bring their lunch and spend the day.

While bluegills can be caught throughout the year in Michigan, the most popular time for the fishing holes is the warmer months of spring, summer and autumn.

STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS

Sealed bids for the purchase of the above bonds will be received by the undersigned at 34027 Cotswold Road, Farmington, Michigan 48024, in the Village of Quakertown on Wednesday, the 23rd day of August, 1967, until 8:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Daylight Saving Time, at which time and place said bids will be publicly opened and read.

Said bonds will be dated August 1, 1967, shall consist of twenty-four (24) bonds of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, numbered consecutively in direct order of maturity from 1 to 24, both inclusive, and will mature serially, without option of prior redemption, as follows:

\$4,000.00	October 1, 1968;
\$2,000.00	October 1, 1969;
\$3,000.00	October 1, 1970;
\$2,000.00	October 1, 1971;
\$3,000.00	October 1st of each of the years 1972 and 1973;
\$2,000.00	October 1, 1974;
\$3,000.00	October 1, 1975;
\$2,000.00	October 1, 1976.

Said bonds shall be coupon bonds and shall bear interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding five per cent (5%) per annum, expressed in multiples of 1/8 or 1/32 of 1%, or both. Said interest shall be payable on October 1, 1967, and semi-annually thereafter on April 1st and October 1st of each year. The interest rate on any one bond shall be at one rate only and all bonds maturing in any one year must carry the same interest rate and each coupon period shall be represented by one interest coupon. Both principal and interest shall be payable at a bank or trust company qualified under the Statutes of the State of Michigan or of the Federal Government to act as paying agent to be designated by the original purchaser of the bonds. Accrued interest to the date of delivery of such bonds shall be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

Said Special Assessment Street Improvement Bonds are issued in anticipation of the collection of an equal amount of the unpaid and future due installments of special assessments on Special Assessment Roll No. 1 for the purpose of defraying the cost of street improvements in said Village. In addition to the special assessments, said bonds pledge the full faith, credit and resources of the Village of Quakertown for their payment.

For the purpose of awarding the bonds, the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining at the rate or rates specified therein the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from September 1, 1967 to their maturity and deducting therefrom any premium. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation produces the lowest interest cost to the Village. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds herein offered, or at a price less than their par value will be considered.

A certified or cashier's check in the sum of \$480.00, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable to the order of the Treasurer of the Village of Quakertown, must accompany each bid as a guaranty of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest will be allowed on the good faith checks, and checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned to each bidder's representative or by registered mail.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of Millar, Canfield, Padock and Stone, attorneys of Detroit, Michigan, approving the legality of the bonds, which opinion will be furnished without expense to the purchaser of the bonds prior to the delivery thereof. The Village shall pay the cost of printing the bonds. The bonds will be delivered at Detroit, Michigan.

The right is reserved to reject any or all bids. Envelopes containing the bids should be plainly marked "Proposal for Bonds."
