Farmington Follows New Rule

Although Farmington and Michigan are generally considered part of the Midwest, the city is actually organized along New England patterns.

This reflects the background of Farmington's founders.

Farmington, like New England, grew up with the township form of government -- a 36-square-mile unit with a classical annual meeting.

By contrast, Detroit had a radial street pattern, like Paris.
