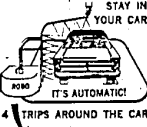

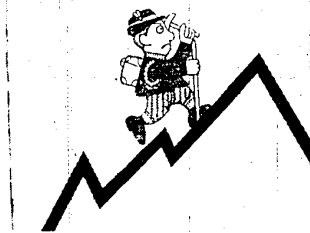
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Stage Benefit For Police And Firemen

Power Politics Charged By Westland Candidate

Gene McKinney, Westland City Council candidate in the Sept. 12 primary, has charged that "power politics and indecision have undermined the critical, early months of this city's government."

McKinney, who served as Chairman of the Westland Charter Commission that planned the structure of the new city's government, said "it appears many office holders have spent the first 14 months trying to determine who has what power instead of building a solid foundation for our future."

"We can't afford another period of inaction and indecision," he said. "What is decided during these early years will influence our community for years to come."

He added:

"While all things cannot be accomplished in the first year, it is discouraging that there has been little success in at least getting started."

McKinney, who covered Nankin Township and Westland government as a newspaperman for 10 years, said it is "imperative that the Mayor and Council show a spirit of cooperation and share the responsibility or progress will bypass our City."

He pointed to the lack of proper development surrounding the Westland Shopping Center which he called the city's "single most important asset," and "virtually no effective, continuing industrial development program" as major areas of inaction.

"These are the programs needed to build a strong commercial and industrial tax base to help pay for services citizens have a right to expect from city government."

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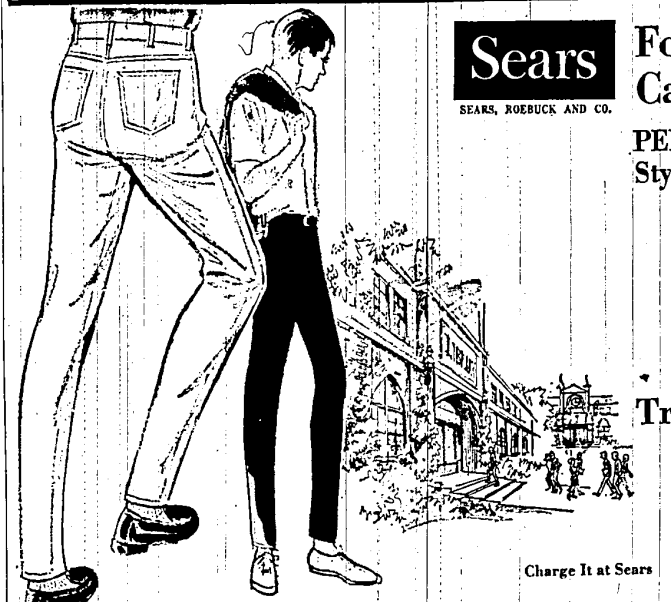
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
