

Detrex Bonding OK'd in Redford

Redford Township faith and credit will pave the way for a \$750,000 research and development facility to locate here.

The Township Board decided Monday to go ahead with a proposal to sell bonds for that amount to finance a research and development plant for Detrex Chemical Industries, Incorporated.

In turn, the township will lease the building to Detrex until the full amount has been recovered, at which time it will become Detrex property.

About \$20,000 or more annual "profit" to the township will be realized by the arrangement, according to Supervisor Aldrick Bellaire. He figures there will be that much new tax base in real

Jr. Olympics Produce New Record Holders

Over 1,000 youngsters swarmed over the field at Lola Valley Junior High School on Tuesday, August 15, 1967 for the 11th Annual Redford Township Parks & Recreation "Junior Olympics."

The various age groups competed for trophies and ribbons which were presented by Supervisor Aldrick Bellaire, Treasurer Edward Kennedy, Trustee Robert Anderson, and Recreation Director Roger Nordstrom.

A total of 23 records were broken and eight more tied in the eight hours of competition.

Sue McLain of Claude Allison was the top point-getter of the day with 36 points as she won six events and also anchored the winning relay team. The 12-year-old also broke two records and tied three more.

Eleven-year-old Diane Swiderk of Vandenberg scored 30 points with five individual wins, while 15-year-old Kirk Taylor of Claude Allison topped the boys totals with 32 points with four firsts and two thirds. M.S.U. star Al Maybach scored 27 points to lead the boys open division.

The younger children competed in the afternoon with the older boys under the lights at night. Vandenberg edged Jefferson 231-218 for the total team championship with Westland 3rd with 148. A total of 16 playgrounds participated.

The fans' favorite of the meet was 5-year-old Scott Adler of Fisher who won the Banham Boys 35-yard dash and then continued to run for another 75 yards despite concerted efforts on the part of officials to stop him. The rest of the boys in the race followed him and everyone had gone over 100 yards before they finally could be

"I wouldn't even know him now if he walked in here," Salvadore said.

In August, 1966, Salvadore said he received another \$2,500 from Gordon and gave Brannoff \$1,000 — making a total of \$4,000 for Brannoff and \$3,500 for himself.

All of the developments involving money came one to two years after the Madison Heights council voted to approve the master plan and the zoning.

"It's ridiculous even to think of bribery in retrospect," he said.

Salvadore was first called before Pratt on Dec. 1, 1966. He testified for 45 minutes with Greenstein present as to his dealings with Gordon and Brannoff.

"He answered every question, every fact that was known and for nine months nothing happened," Greenstein said.
