Two Livonians To Get Degrees

Two Livonia men are candidates for master's degrees in the largest August commencement in the history of Miami University, Oxford, Ohio.

There are 875 candidates listed for degrees, including 259 for master's degrees. Highest number of degrees awarded at any previous August commencement was 791 last year, when a preliminary announcement listed 833 candidates. Before that only three August commencements had topped 400.

Howard pointed out to The Observer that his \$21,500 salary before the new contract was approved placed him at the bottom of superintendent's salaries in districts with 15,000 or more enrollment. The median of 43 Wayne County districts last year was \$22,500 but has risen during the past year.
