The FYGC's plan to operate an all-out program is to enlist agencies, organizations and service clubs to assume responsibility for its operation and administration.

The governing body would be known as a "Community Council."

IN THE EVENT, however, matching funds are supplied by the Mott Foundation, responsibility for running the program would rest with the School Board.

Personnel for a community program would be both volunteer and paid, with the paid staff bearing major responsibility.
