of \$.27 per million gallons beginning Nov. 1. This would cost the city an estimated \$18,000 a year more for water, according to Dinan.

The first portion of the two phase program calls for the installation of a 12-inch water main at Nine Mile and Gill Rd, and the construction of a pumping station at the current reservoir at a total cost of \$205,000.

THE SECOND STEP would be to install a fourth pump at the Nies Mille Station and construct a new 500,000 gailon reservoir. This would cost \$52,700, but could be timed to the population increase and rate of water use in the city according to Dinan.

Dinan said that the city had floated bonds in 1955 to construct the water system. A total of \$45,000 remains to be paid on these bonds and the city manager offered the opinion that the entire cost could be refinanced over a longerperiod time and result in no insertation the annual payments to the city.

Farmington Township Hikes Rate For Water Customers
