

Youth Guidance Committee

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Delewsy and Frank Kasun, local school principals; Wesley Mitchell; Clayton Weeks; Elaine Plamer; Mrs. Bob Smith; Cpl. Norman Stainbrook, of the Township Police Department; and Hugh Watson.

Mitchell is chairman of the fact finding committee and Bloomberg, a psychiatrist, is chairman of the case work committee.

FINANCES for the committee's work with youth and their families comes from the city and township.

The township recently increased its appropriation from \$200 every quarter to \$300, although payment is yet to be made. The city gives \$300 annually.

Approximately 20 different service groups and individuals have contributed \$400 over a fiscal year.

Hopes of the committee were to hold the \$400 a separate fund for a financial beginning for the community school program, but the fund has been dipped into.

The committee set up and conducted a highly productive program at Gill School last school year.

Success at Gill is what has encouraged Youth Guidance members to investigate the Mott concept of total year-round use of school facilities for youth and adult level programs ranging from recreational activities through adult seminars.

WHETHER it is within the purview of the committee's constitution and by-laws to undertake a Farmington community school program is questionable.

Soliciting public funds would make work of the group an-

swerable to the public in a context differing from the way it is now.

If the committee's work is simply to "guide" it is fulfilling that capacity with no attempt at expansion.

One committee member, who asked not to be quoted, has called the committee's constitution "full of ambiguous statements with conflicting by-laws."

The committee says it is presently in the "process of reorganizing," but Probate Court would not let it rewrite its constitution.

Whether reorganization will open the door to expansion of activities by the group remains to be seen.

It plans to present its case for continued work to the public at a meeting Dec. 5 in the City Council chambers.
