Police Seek Witness

Her view of just what occur-red is important to the erectual disposition of the case, Inspec-tor Russ Conway declared.

The officer added that the unidentified witness is said to have been driving a gray 1905 Oldsmobile, passing through the same intersection within seconds of the fatal crash. She did not stop, however, he said.

The accident claimed the life of Richard J. Zack, 20, of Lincoln Park, whose vehicle was northbound on Halstead when struck by one driven by Robert K. Spradling, of Northville. Spradling at the time was driving eastward on 12 Mile.

Street lights at two Holiday Park subdivision intersections have been given the go-ahead by the Detroit Edison Company following vocal petitions for the lights by a Holiday Park


