

# Tragedy Strikes Family Again

Mr. and Mrs. Edwin R. Oglesby, 28403 Harwoodwood Dr., Farmington, were notified Tuesday night, Nov. 7, that their daughter, Mrs. Nancy Jean Vogt, was killed in an automobile accident near her home in Grand Rapids.

Mrs. Vogt was the second of the Oglesby children to be killed in a car accident. The oldest son, John Edwin, lost his life in a traffic accident in 1965 while a student in California.

Mrs. Vogt was alone at the time of the accident and the Oglesbys have no further details of the tragedy. She was the wife of James Vogt, vice president of the

Knapp-Vogt Co., of Grand Rapids. In addition to her husband and parents, Mrs. Vogt is survived by a daughter, Debbie Jean, and two brothers, Ronald C. and Lance Corp. Richard L. Oglesby, stationed in Vietnam.

Funeral arrangements were set for Friday, pending arrival of Corp. Oglesby from Vietnam.

## Viet Victim Resided In Area

Spec. 4 Richard Smith, 21, of Pontiac Township, who attended Westbrook Elementary School and Clarenceville Junior High, was killed in action in Vietnam last week. Word of his death was sent by the U.S. Defense Department to Smith's wife, Joyce. Six weeks ago, Mrs. Smith gave birth to a son, Richard C., whom Smith had not seen. Born in Detroit, Smith was an employee of Fisher Body Division before entering service. Surviving besides his wife and son are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John R. Smith, of Port Richey, Fla.; two brothers, John, with the U.S. Coast Guard in Semmes, Ala., and Curtis, at home; a sister, Patricia, at home; a grandmother, Mrs. John Smith, of Detroit; and a grandfather, Clyde Bish, Sr., of Bradenton, Fla.

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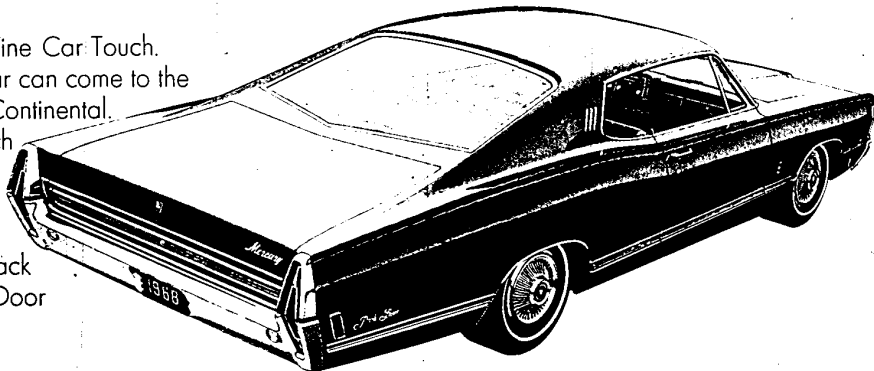
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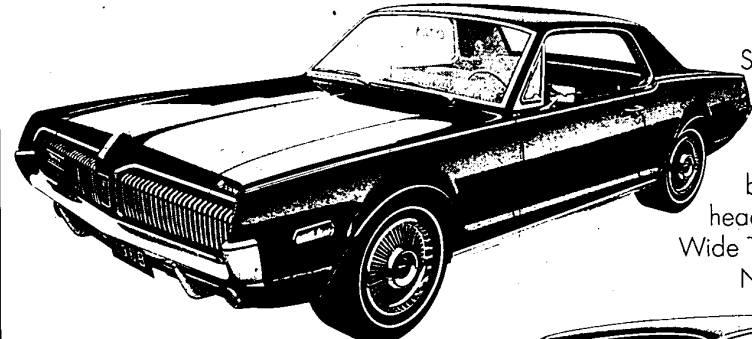
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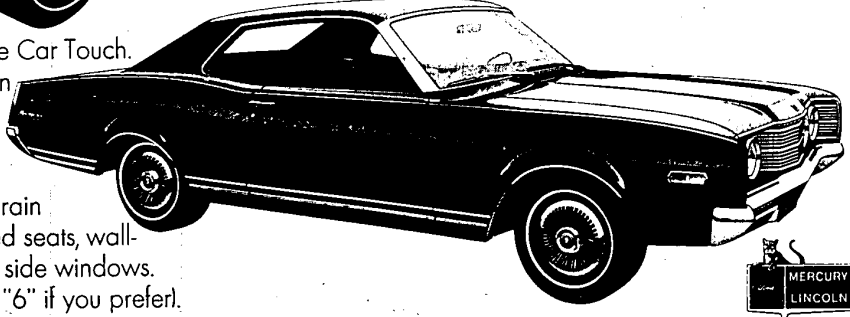
