Dr. Lenox To Head Ann Arbor Council

Dr. G. Merrill Lenox, who will close his work as executive director of the Metropolitan Detroit Council of Churches Dec. 31, has announced he will become executive director of the Ann Arbor-Washington Council of Churches.

Dr. Lenox, 65, commented that he has always planned "to accept another fulltime job with a real challenge."

"I am delighted for this privilege to head the ecumenical enterprise in our neighbor city of Ann Arbor and the surrounding community," he added.

"Through the years I have been greatly impressed with the caliber of the clergy and lay leaders in the Ann Arbor-Washington area."

THE ANN ARBOR - WASHINGTON COUNCIL carries on the comprehensive program of any city Council but in addition has taken into its structure an

organization known as "Ann Arbor Independent Housing, Inc." This is a project to provide improved housing for the residents of the community, particularly those in the lower income bracket.

During Dr. Lenox's service in Detroit, about 10 important new areas of work have been introduced, the staff has grown from about a dozen members to the present 43.

The budget has increased from \$60,000 in 1947 to more than \$185,000 in 1967. A building has been acquired for the Council and, since its now-open, plans are already under way for a much more capacious and suitable edifice.

UNDER his leadership, the Council has published a monthly tabloid - "The Church Newsletter" and was the first community to participate with the Roman Catholic Church in "Project Equality" which has gained national significance.

He has conducted a radio commentary over Station WJR entitled "Religion in Action" and served for 18 years as Michigan correspondent for the Christian Century.

Dr. Lenox was appointed to a number of commissions and boards by the Governors of the State of Michigan and the Mayors of the City of Detroit. He now serves as a member of Governor Romney's Panel on Ethical and Moral Issues and on his Fair Campaign Practices Commission.

HE SERVES on Mayor Cavanagh's Metropolitan Detroit Citizens Development Corporation and in other capacities. He has been a member of the Board of the National Council of Churches almost since its inception and a member of its Central Committee on Policy and Strategy for several years and serves also on the Program Board for the Division of Christian Unity and as a member of the Department of Councils of Churches for the National Council.

He is a past president of the National Association of Council Secretaries which is a professional organization, including the employed staff of the World, National, state and local Councils of Churches in Amsterdam, Evanston and New Delhi, and plans to attend the Fourth Assembly in Uppsala, Sweden, next summer.

Handicapped Children Get SS Class

A class for handicapped children has been added to the Sunday School program of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Farmington.

Organization of the class, with Mrs. Nadine Serra as teacher, was announced recently.

Mrs. Serra, who is secretary of the project, has been teaching a Saturday session for handicapped children in the Redford Lutheran Church for about a year.

It meets for an hour each Sunday at 9:40 a.m. in the church, located at the corner of Middlebelt and Eight Mile Roads.

All children mentally or physically handicapped are welcome to the class, regardless of religious affiliation.

The special instruction is part of a Lutheran church project for the entire area known as "Christian Education for the Handicapped."
