HOLLY-
THE CHRISTMAS GREEN
Holly is the traditional green of Christmas. Its origin goes back many centuries and it is said that the spiny green leaves, with their bright red berries, represent the crown of thorns Christ wore on the cross. It is one of the few plants that bears fruit at this time of year, when everything is usually so drab and lifeless. Holly, in one of its many forms, is found in every part of the world. The bark and berries of some varieties are used for making medicine and there is a kind grown in South America whose leaves are used to brew a tea-like beverage. The holly we use for Christmas decorations is English holly which is grown on farms in Oregon and Washington and is specially treated to make it last longer. Besides the traditional green holly with the red berries, there is a variegated leaf holly which has a silver-edged green leaf and a new variety this year, the gold-berried holly which has the same rich green leaves but with a yellow-gold berry instead of red.

Fresh evergreen wreaths of balsam and Oregon fir are also a traditional part of Christmas. Come in and see our large selection that we have on display, beautifully decorated.
