New Diabetes Series To Be Launched Soon

A series of five classes for diabetic persons and members of their families will be held on consecutive Thursdays beginning Jan. 11, from 7:30 to 9 p.m., at the Shaper School of Nursing, adjacent to Sinai Hospital, 6787 W. Outer Drive in Detroit.

The classes, which are free and open to the public, are co-sponsored by Sinai Hospital and the Michigan Diabetes Association, a Torch Drive Service. It is necessary to obtain a referral from a physician in order to attend. Information and application forms may be obtained by writing to the Michigan Diabetes Association,

10737 W. McNichols Road in Detroit, or by calling 342-9333. The initial class will be conducted by a physician, the second and third by a nurse and the fourth and fifth by a dietitian. Subjects covered will include the nature and care of diabetes, insulin and injection techniques, tests and personal hygiene, diet and diet management.

area residents. Each club has approximately 100 members.

Club members meet weekly and agree upon a committee to plan and purchase food for the next week. Each member is assessed a specific amount of money and weekly buyers are selected. Food buyers start out at the early morning hours to price food at markets throughout the city.

Several clubs are assisted by local merchants who contribute trucks for the buying expeditions.

Success in the attempt to reduce high costs of food is evident by the fact that at the Thanksgiving holiday 18-pound turkeys were bought for \$4. Vegetables for a family of four over a weeks period cost club members a dollar. Assorted

fruits are also purchased for a nominal price.

The cooperative buying club plan was initiated and developed by the City of Detroit's Mayor's Committee for Human Resources Development. Assisting in the project are other agencies such as the VISTA Volunteers, community churches and businesses in the inner city area.

An important objective of the cooperative buying clubs is to convince poverty area residents that by working together in cooperative projects they can overcome some of the problems of poverty.

Hospital Graduates Aides

Wayne County General Hospital recently graduated its group of older volunteer trainees.

These ladies have completed an eight-week training program in which they learned basic nursing skills and occupational therapy techniques. Their class included lectures by a wide variety of hospital personnel and various community agencies.
