Club members meet a committee to plan and purchase food for the next week. Each member is assessed a specific amount of money and weekly buyers are selected. Purchases are made the early morning hours to price food at markets throughout the city.

Several clubs are assisted by local merchants who contribute trucks for the buying expeditions.

Success in the attempt to reduce high costs of food is evident by the fact that at the time of giving the 500-pound turkey was bought for \$4. Vegetables for a family of four over a week's period cost club members a dollar. Aspirated

fruits are also purchased for a nominal price.

The cooperative buying club plan was initiated and developed by the City of Detroit's Mayor's Committee for Human Resources Development, Assistance in the project are other agencies such as the VISTA Volunteers, community

churches and businesses in the inner city area.

An important objective of the cooperative buying clubs is to convince poverty area residents that by working together in cooperative projects they can overcome some of the problems of poverty.
