**Lutheran Fund Drive For Education Half Completed**

With one-fifth of the congregations reporting, The American Lutheran Church has passed the half-way mark in its \$20,000,000 Lutheran Education Fund (LEAF). Announcement of pledges totaling \$10,020,340 was made this week in Minneapolis, Minn., by Dr. George S. Schultz, director of the LEAF campaign.

"This figure represents pledges from about 1,000 of the 5,000 congregations of The American Lutheran Church," Dr. Schultz said. "Many congregations have indicated that they will conduct their campaign during 1968 and many others have conducted their campaign but have not reported their pledges," he said.

"I am convinced that when all the pledges are in, we will have passed our goal," Dr. Schultz said.

Capital funds obtained from the LEAF campaign will be used for new buildings at the churches, three seminaries, twelve colleges, and two state universities, as well as new facilities at some of the state universities where The American Lutheran Church operates in a campus ministry program.

**3 Named To Church Assembly**

Three Presbyterian clergymen in this area have been elected commissioners to the General Assembly of the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A., to be held in May. The elections were announced by the Presbytery of Detroit.

Those named are the Rev. George W. Ramsey, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Farmington; the Rev. Henry J. Welch, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Plymouth; and Dr. Richard C. Dunne, pastor of the Roseville Presbyterian Church of Livonia.

Dr. Dunneberger is chairman of the ecumenical relations committee of the synod and has been at Rosedale Gardens since 1960.

The Rev. Ramsey has served in his present post for seven years, and is a graduate of Grove City College and Western Theological Seminary, Pittsburgh. The Rev. Welch, who has served the Plymouth church since 1943, is a graduate of the University of Rochester and McCormick Seminary.

They will be among 800 church leaders and will be official delegates to the Assembly, set for May 16 to 22 in Minneapolis, Minn.
