



Township Studies Bids

Bids for the proposed new addition to the Farmington Township Hall were opened Dec. 26.

The three low bidders and their estimated construction time were:

Felker Construction Co. of Detroit, \$381,750, 240 days;

Pinkert Construction Co. of Birmingham, \$383,900, 270 days;

F.J. Miller Inc. of Southfield, \$389,000, 270 days.

A total of 12 bids were received. All of the bids have been referred to the township engineers and a decision is expected before Jan. 15.

APPROVAL for the new addition was given by the township trustees in the spring. The township has the cash on hand to finance the addition.

The new building, which will be located just across the existing township hall, is expected to be ready in the third quarter of 1968.

It will house the administration offices of the township along with the court facility. A meeting room, which will serve as a courtroom and chambers of the township board and planning commission, will be included.
