Recreation Agency Is Under Fire

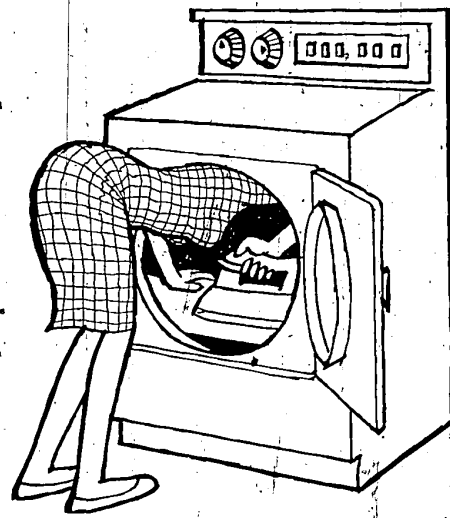
The Farmington Area Recreation Commission (FARC) and its composition came under scrutiny Monday night during the Township Board meeting.

Township Trustee Earl Oppertbauer observed that it was just about a year ago that we were locking horns with the city about the proposed makeup of the FARC.

"The recreation season draw near with the program as the p.w.n." Oppertbauer continued, "and we agreed to continue the representation for one more year."

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AT ISSUE was the basis of representation on the commission. Currently the city, township, Farmington and Clarenceville Schools all have representatives.

The township adopted the position that it was entitled to three representatives on the commission because of its population ratio.

Township officials proposed that the Farmington schools have two representatives as it provides the playground space. The city and Clarenceville District were to have one representative each under the township plan.

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
