Farmington High Swamps Walled Lake

The defense "arrived" and with it Farmington High's basketball team turned in its best showing of the 1967-68

season—an 83-56 romp over Walled Lake. The victory upped the Farmington record to 3-1 in the inter-

league and put the Falcons in position to tie Pontiac, Northern for the top slot when the two teams clash a week from Friday night. There's no cage action at Farmington this week. The players, as well as the other students, have some other major battles to perform—mid-year examinations. "It was a long-time coming," said Ray Boyles, the Farmington coach, in commenting upon the defensive job his charges turned in against Walled Lake. "We have worked for weeks to slow down our opposition. We knew we had the offense."

LYNOTT wound up the scoring leader with nine baskets and three free throws for 21 points. Hamilton had 17 points, White 14, Himmelspach 12 and Randy Cleveland nine.

Hamilton also starred defensively when he held Greg Fogle, Walled Lake's great star, to only nine points. Fogle has been averaging in excess of 15 points per game.

UP! GOING CURTAIN

"The Tragical History of Doctor Faustus," the original 17th century Christopher Marlowe version, was given a significant revival by the Eastern Michigan Players at the Quirk Theater in Ypsilanti.

Not too many professional groups or University troupes tussle with the powerful Marlowe speeches. Their bombast and poetic beauty keep many a director from attempting a classic by Shakespeare's contemporary, Chris Marlowe.

Even such a directorial giant as Sir Tyrone Guthrie stumbled badly with an inept Broadway production of "Tamburlaine," a historical drama by Marlowe filled with liberal amounts of nautical fervor. The Burtons,

Liz and Dick, recently made a film version of "Faustus" and early reports indicate it is to be avoided like the Bubonic plague.

DIRECTOR Michel Elie in his first assignment for the EMU Players is to be highly complimented for his straightforward, no-nonsense approach to this seldom-produced Elizabethan classic.

His intensive work with Richard Worwick in the title role paid off as the young actor grew more and more secure in his role as the evening progressed. If Worwick had been given a little more support from the costume department and the lighting designer, his interpretation might have been twice as effective.

Since Worwick's thesping should be judged on its own merits, it is best to be honest and indicate that he did only an acceptable job under the prevailing circumstances. His constant companion (Mephistopheles) was sufficiently sinister. Joseph Del Giudice deserves special plaudits for his effective characterization.

"Dr. Faustus" literally calls for a cast of hundreds and this, no doubt, is another reason for its limited production. Dr. McElroy called on many of the EMU favorites seen in leading roles in past productions. Gary Carpenter, Bob MacGill, Ben Mordecai, John Schudel, and Matt Locricchio performed perfectly in a multiplicity of roles. It's always heart-warming to know that the repertory spirit prevails at EMU and these veterans can be called upon to do a small role as aptly.

But even then the triumph came the hard way—Schoolcraft had to rally in a five minute overtime in which it scored 16 points while holding Monroe to nine. The score was knotted 78-78 at the end of regulation time.

Guard Karl Gulbranson was the big gunner in the extra period, dropping in six points. He and Al Jose collected 18 each to top the scorers.

Schoolcraft showed considerable improvement in a losing battle with Alpena Friday night, losing, 100-89, in another game on the Northville floor. Earlier Alpena had whipped SC by more than 50 points.

Center Steve Moore was high for Schoolcraft with 26 points followed by Gulbranson's 18 and 10 by Jose. Sharpshooting John Thomas, a former Willow Run High star, had 28 points for Alpena.

Schoolcraft swings back into action Wednesday night when it entertains St. Clair of Windsor at Northville. Game time is 8 p.m.

"It was an old story for us," said coach Bob Morris of Sorrows.

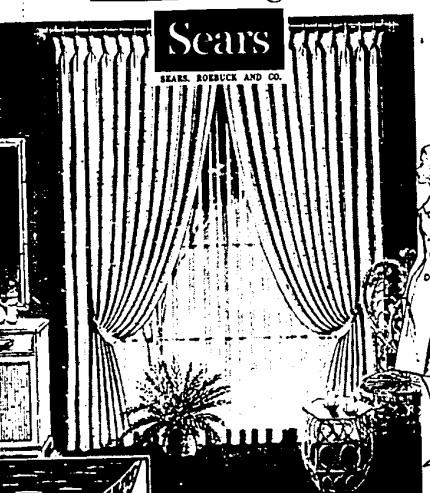
"They beat us badly in rebounds and we also turned the ball over too much."

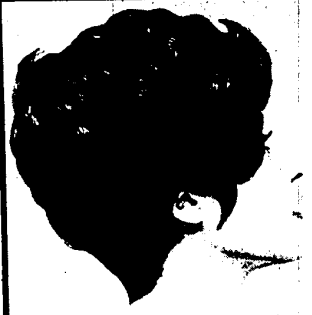
