## Schoolcraft Finally Ends Losing Streak

But even then the triumph came the hard way—Schoolcraft had to rally in a five minute overtime in which it scored 10 points while holding Monroe to nine. The score was knotted 78-78 at the end of regulation time.

Guard Karl Culbranson was the big gunner in the extra period, scoring in six points. He and Al Jose collected 18 each to top the scorers.

Schoolcraft showed considerable improvement in a losing battle with Alpena Friday night, losing 100-89. In another game on the Northville floor, Earlier Alpena had whupped SC by more than 50 points.

Central Ave. Moore was high for Schoolcraft with 25 points followed by Culbranson's 18 and 10 by Jose. Sharpshooting John Thomas, a former Willow Run High star, had 20 points for Alpena.

Schoolcraft swings back into action Wednesday night when it entertains St. Clair of Windsor at Northville. Game time is 8 p.m.
