Paula Boys Will Study In France

Paula Boys, an Albion College junior from Farmington, will be among 18 Albion and Hope College students leaving Feb. 5 for Grenoble, France, for a four month "maximum immersion" course in learning the French language.

Miss Boys is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert P. Boys, of 32519 W. Wayburn, Farmington.

They will attend the French language school of the University of Grenoble for one semester, and will live in dormitories with students from around the world. Only one per cent of those enrolled will be American.

Began last year by Albion, the course is described by Dr. James Keller, chairman of Albion's department of modern languages, as being designed "to provide students with a real sensitivity for the language."

The group from Michigan will fly from New York to Luxembourg Feb. 5 and after four days sight-seeing in Paris will arrive in Grenoble Feb. 11 just at the peak of the winter Olympic Games taking place there.

FHS Girl Is Named Homemaker

Mariane McGivern scored high at Farmington High School in the 1968 Betty Crocker Search for the American Homemaker of Tomorrow last given nationwide Dec. 5.

She was winner among 603,798 girls in 15,079 high schools across the country who registered to take the test dealing with homemaking.

For her achievement, Miss McGivern will receive a specially designed Betty Crocker silver charm and becomes eligible for scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$5,000.

Next step is the state homemaker contest. Winner of that will go with a school advisor on an expense-paid tour of Washington, D.C. and Williamsburg. The contest climaxes in Minneapolis with the naming of the 1968 Betty Crocker All-American Homemaker of Tomorrow.
