# Township Totals 375 Fires In '67

Carelessness caused more of Farmington Township's fires than any other factor in 1967, reported Chief George Hume this week in an analysis of the 375 runs made during the year by township fire fighters.

"Carelessness in burning rubbish, carelessness in smoking habits and carelessness in the use of matches on the part of children were to blame for most of our fires," said Hume.

He reported that there were 90 house fires during the year, 49 automobile fires and 63 grass blazes. In addition, the department answered 73 rescuercator calls and 79 which Hume classified as miscellaneous. The

year's total number of false alarms, 21, was the largest the department ever recorded.

Total property losses by fire in the township for 1967 reached \$355,430, said the chief. Hume singled out another problem for comment:

"There are many homes and businesses that do not make their addresses visible from the road, or post no numbers at all.

"In case of emergency calls to fire, police, ambulance or medical services, when records count, this could make a great difference regarding loss of life or property."
